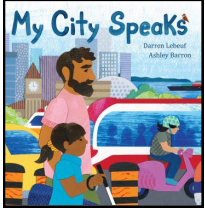
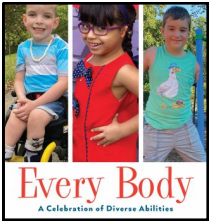

EARLY LITERACY TIP

In *Every Body*, there are plenty of opportunities to practice using words that describe bodies and different abilities. There are also lots of words that describe activities we do using our bodies, like playing and using our senses. Learning these words helps build vocabulary, which is knowing the names of things. Having a strong vocabulary of verbs and adjectives involving bodies is essential for learning how to read, since people (who all have bodies!) are often the heart of stories.
