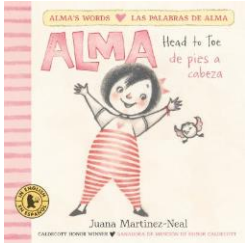
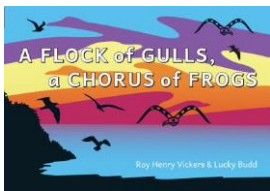

Reading Readiness Tips:

When we sing, we are slowing down language so children can hear the smaller parts and sounds that make up words. Knowing that words are made up of smaller parts is an early literacy skill called Phonological Awareness. This skill will help them later when they are starting to sound out words while reading, because they will already know that words are made up of smaller sounds that are strung together. Repeat familiar songs to build confidence and interest in singing and reading!
